7. Around the Table

Mayor Pamela Gross- "First of all I would like to thank the organizing committee for doing a wonderful job at the Christmas games as well as Francis and the Healthy Living Department and everyone else who volunteered and took part and everyone who participated in our festive activities, it really goes a long way it really brings community spirit to our community. I know that there were side sponsors including the Elks and community members made this Christmas a great holiday.

Congratulations to Councillor Aaron Pedersen on the arrival of your new baby.

We have a confirmed case in the community of distemper in dogs. Distemper is a prevented illness in dogs by vaccine, however you have to pay for the vaccinations. I would like a motion going forward to request for funding from the Government for paid vaccinations for dogs in the community to keep dogs healthy.

I sit on the committee for tourism on behalf of the Municipality, there are about 12 members across Canada it is a very interesting committee in terms of how the Federal Committees run and it is going to be for the next year and the next meeting will be in Montreal and it will be next week. I have been able to talk to more communities about tourism and cruise ships and the communities in the east and they have expressed that

they are not in favor of cruise ships visiting their communities so I would like to have that discussion with Council.

It would be a perfect time to talk about it in the comprehensive community planning sessions as community stakeholders to see if it is something that our community does profit from and if it is valued and something that we would like to see here. There are also a lot of different types of tourism through business travel, bird watching, and just people coming up to encounter Nunavut. We would like to do an assessment in terms of where we are in reference points.

I'd like to thank those who organized Christmas gifts for the Municipality. We have ordered extras, first we will have extras for sale first to our staff then open it up to the community.

Council would like to congratulate our community in becoming a finalist in a competition amongst NAM that NAAMA put forward with Pinnguaq and another organization. So, this competition is Nunavut wide it is a 10M dollar prize which would go towards working with the youth in creating gaming software which they have already been doing with Pinnguaq and it would be in Inuinnaqtun and Inuktitut. There are five finalists and we are one of the five.

I also wanted to Congratulate the welding project as well as project that represents Cambridge Bay for Inuinnaqtun both projects have been short listed for the Arctic Inspiration Prize."

Councillor Angulalik Pedersen- "I just wanted to mention that the distemper vaccine also clears four other viruses, Parvo, adino, para influenza. This virus is very contagious and could spread within a few weeks within the community, you don't even have to have contact with the dog this virus can spread through the air. This is a really good vaccination to get and I am hoping that we get that funding from the Government of Nunavut for it."

CAAO Jim MacEachern- "The only thing that I have today is that the tradeshow is coming up so it is a very busy time preparing for the tradeshow right now. We are almost sold out on exhibitor space, we are actually almost sold out on sponsorships this year. There are a lot of new businesses from Vancouver and other places. Everyone on Council will be receiving an invitation for yourselves plus one so please RSVP ahead of time as we have a waiting list."

Mayor Pamela Gross- "I wanted to say congratulations to the welding project "Scrap to Art" as well as the Inuinnaqtun project which I am a part of. Both of these projects have been shortlisted for the Arctic Inspiration Prize. I won't be here during the Kitikmeot Trade Show, but it is very exciting we have a lot of delegation going to this celebration."

CAO Marla Limousin- "In the proposal for the \$100,000.00 they requested for delegates to be there so the cost for delegates is included in the funding that they are giving us. We are going to bring Andrew Kitigon who has stepped up to the plate and going to be the team leader so we are coaching and preparing him to deliver a success speech or a grateful to be here speech. We also have Kaitak Allukpik coming as he has been there from the beginning and is very much a leader in the program with the boys. Attima Hadlari is going as well as he has been the cultural coach for 2.5 years as well as Kerry Illerbrun who is their mentor will be going as well as myself.

The AIP prize money would go towards more equipment and a training program so that those boys can train in a summer camp environment other kids from other communities. It will help others to learn as well as help bring revenue to the facility as we want it to stand alone. We hope to have it open in May of this year 2019.

The funding for the Coalition project has been approved as is the funding for the Comprehensive Community Plan. The Coalition funding will fund a staff position ½ time. The Coalition is comprised of every sector of the Community who works together to identify the strengths and weaknesses of the Community as well as working with the CCP as a Stakeholder. We received funding from September to the end of March and an additional \$100,000.00 for the next two years. So, we will use some of that for a technical support worker."

Mayor Pamela Gross- "I would like to bring forward the motion to request funding for the distemper vaccine for the community as it can be detrimental for the well being of our dogs and our community members."
