j. Single use plastics strategy

Mayor Pamela Gross-"so this is something people are becoming more cognizant of and thinking more about the environment coming back to those days where to pollute the ocean and our wildlife and our land. We spoke about the beautification of our community and our eco-system and seeing how much micro plastics in the ocean and seeing the animals of the water affected by this and ultimately we are digesting that and it is not good for the planet so we would like to do our part and bring this forward to talk about us being trend setters for Nunavut and to Canada to say that we are doing our part in working toward saving our footprint."

Councillor Wiz Mohammed- "this was a fairly lengthy discussion that we had at our Public Works meeting a document was drafted and put together and it is a phased approach it is what the hamlet is looking at and we talked about announcing it on Earth Day but Earth Day is coming too soon so we don't have time to do that so we are talking about announcing it during Omingmak Frolics and as far as what the Mayor said about the straws and what they saw at the Aquarium so we are looking for funding to go out and get reusable straws and have an amount to kick off at Frolics and it is something that we need to do we also spoke about it with the Federal Government staff that were here and they like the idea."

Councillor Sandi Gillis- "Education about reusing plastic bags etc. is a good step to start with this strategy."

Councillor Wiz Mohammed- "this will take time it may take a year or even two years to have the community use to this but at least it is a start, buying reusable bags and handing them out would be a good idea to help start this strategy but Councillor Sandi Gillis you are right it is an education aspect because this is new to the community."

Mayor Pamela Gross- "I have been looking at the different ideas that other places have for ideas that we may be able to use and something to think about to work towards."

Councillor Wiz Mohammed- "Is it feasible to begin looking for funding to have these reusable straws and bags for the community?"



Mayor Pamela Gross- "we have spoke about the feasts or gatherings we would like to request for community members to bring their own dishes so that we aren't buying and using Styrofoam and plastic dishes and cutlery this would be a great way to begin the process as well.

Also, the school in Kugluktuk have a really nice water filtration system that is very easy to fill up a water bottle and that would help and having them at the Community Hall and the Arena in the places where we have public events."

Councillor Sandi Gillis- "I am agreeing with your idea with having the community bring their own dishes to community events or feasts."

8. Around the Table

Councillor Wiz Mohammed- "I attended a couple of sessions with the therapeutic justice which is a pilot project in which Cambridge Bay was selected for which helps in finding ways to find ways in the justice system it was well attended the MLA was there as well as the Deputy Minister of justice, the RCMP detachment, the chief superintendent of the territory, KIA, NTI, and about fifty odd people attended. They talked about the population which was 1700 people but it is more like 2,000 for the population so we will be looking at more resources the project is fully funded and if it is successful, we will see where it goes. We took them out on the ice road and it was blistering, as well as the airport and showed the problems that we have and took them on the airside



they were supposed to be with us for about forty five minutes but we were with them for about an hour and a half and also took them around town. They really enjoyed the food that was provided by the hamlet. We also talked to them about the arena and the mold that we had. We had some pretty good contacts with the federal government we also spoke about the multi-plex with them and they were very supportive and interested in that."

Mayor Pamela Gross- "great I am very happy that you attended on our behalf thank you for participating and sharing the insight of our community."

Councillor Susie Kemukton- "regarding the cruise ship visitors one year I made a wall hanging and there was a lady that was interested and came back to look at it three times and kept negotiating a price we should make it clear that there should not be any negotiating prices for the hard work that the community members put in."

Deputy Mayor Christina L'Heureux- "I just wanted to mention that there has been so many thefts at the store and it is a huge problem and they aren't stealing little things they are stealing food, because they are hungry and we have been offering them jobs and trying to incorporate food allowance with their pay but they don't want jobs. This impacts the community."

Mayor Pamela Gross- "we need to do something about this problem in the community and have some type of education, we need to help break old cycles.

I would like to welcome everyone that is in the community we have a lot happening right now it is so exciting to know that we have so many opportunities in such a short time from the hockey tournament to the drum dance festival as well as the magician and motivators and the people that are here to boost our community and our community spirit is feeling high right now."
