- a. Vicki Aitaok came in presenting to council about the Crystal Serenity Cruise Ship that would be arriving in Cambridge Bay on August 29, 2016. The ship with be starting in the west at Seward, Alaska and ending in New York City, New York; they will have a total of 12 stops during this trip. This cruise ship will have a total of 1700 passengers and crew on board; making it the largest ship to be passing thru Cambridge Bay. This ship will make three stops in NWT/Nunavut they are: Uluhaktok, Cambridge Bay, and Pond Inlet. This ship will be accompanied by a Canadian Coast Guard Ice Breaker during this trip. Vicki would like to present this to the Community and have a plan for their arrival. There will be 150-200 people in town at a time being shuttled to and from Gravel Pitt within a 12 hour period; 8AM to 8PM. Planning and preparation will need to be done. Sgt. Shawn Gee asked where they are going to be doing the immigration/customs clearance. There will be a couple of people from Crystal Serenity on June 9th and 10th coming before they start the cruise and I am sure that they would like to meet with council.
- b. Sgt. Lalonde gave statistics for the month of March. A majority of the crime committed during the month was related to alcohol. The Northern Store stated that they had processed more than \$300,000 in Income Tax returns during the first week of tax season; the second week they had given out another \$200,000. This represents only the tax returns processed through the Northern Store and does not account for additional tax returns. With it being tax time, we had a number of calls of which, 90% were related to domestic violence. In addition, we have an increase in vandalisum complaints with the majority related to damages done by hockey pucks. As we are all aware, the kids here like to play street hockey and we suggest building 3 outdoor hockey areas for the various age groups so we can provide them with a safe place to play. Sgt. Lalonde also stated that he was looking into the way the liquor commission governed the issuing of liquor permits and was unable to get stats or answers for the questions he had; this needs to be looked in to.

 The RCMP Annual Priority Programs Areas include: 1. Substance Abuse 2. Mental Health & Suicide 3. Youth at Risk 4. Crime Prevention Program
- c. Amanda Dioron from CGS atternded the meeting at the request of Council to provide an update and answer questions regarding the announcement by the Federal Government of \$4.2 million in approved funding for the community arena. The arena will have an inspection done in May/June once the ice is gone. They will be checking the structure, the sewage lines and the mold contaminants. August 2017 is when renovations and remediation would begin in the arena; depending on the severity of the remediation, the arena could be closed for one season of hockey. The investigation to determine the scope of work could cost \$200,000 \$300,000 but this is required in order to identify the priority health and safety issues. Amanda suggests start lobbying for it now and it should be done by 2020; this should be a good time to be partnering up with CHARS for funding for these types of projects and writing letters to the MLA.
