10. CAO Report

a. Recreational Infrastructure overview – CAO Limousin "With the presentation of the Recreation Centre by the students, some of the information that Council wishes may be addressed so suggesting that this item be tabled at this time".

11. Around the Table

Councillor Derek Elias: "I would like to raise the issue of the airline merger. Marla, can you send me the Hamlet's concerns in terms of the airline merger we discussed with our Economic Development Committee? That way we can take it forward from there."

CAO Limousin said that the letter would be forwarded to Councillor Elias.

Councillor Jenna Kamingoak: "Before our next meeting, can we get some background information on Aaliak Consulting? There are so many people in our community that are wondering who they are, what are they doing, and why they are taking over Hamlet programming and what are our staff doing now that the programs are now handed over to this private company. There are a lot of rumors going around town and people looking for information regarding this whole consulting company. I checked the website out and asked questions but didn't get a response."



CAO Marla Limousin: "I am doing an inquiry on that right now. I will wait until the next meeting and then I'll send that to you. I am working with Charles and Francis on what happened. The consulting contract that was approved was dollars put forward by the radio station to train our MYAC students on reporting and recording and understanding radio and communication systems and high-tech graphics. He's got the studio set up in the Co-op, but he's also advertising it as his own program where it's our program. Another thing that I am confused about is the Tool making program, I don't understand this one and who's project that is. I thought that it was under Wellness. Let me get back to you when I know more."

Councillor Derek Elias: "In my honest opinion, if the Hamlet is going to be going out for consulting services, go out to Tenders and promote Inuit businesses. If at all 100% possible."

Deputy Mayor Angulalik Pedersen: "I brought this up with Marla already, but Water and Sewer services have come up again multiple times with households who haven't gotten services for multiple days. It's usually on the North side of town"

Mayor Pamela Gross: "The Taxi issue should be brought up again."

Councillor Derek Elias: "That issue will be brought up to our Economic Development Committee meeting."

Councillor Sandi Gillis: "I noticed in the minutes that we tabled the issue about the truck that was being parked on the side of the road on Nattiq street. It's still parked there."

Councillor Wilfred Wilcox: "I just wanted to mention that I heard about a young girl being found in a very dangerous situation and passed out. She was a 12-year-old. That's bad and a serious issue."

CAO Maria Limousin: "She was found by one of our employees doing his morning checks."

Councillor Derek Elias: "This is something that we will have to be keeping a close eye on, putting out community watch programs."



Councillor Sandi Gillis: "My very first year living in Cambridge Bay, I volunteered to go to Calgary. I took three young teenagers with me. We went to a MADD conference and it opened my eyes with how many thousands teenagers have drinking addictions and drug addictions at age 12, 13, 14. What we brought back was how to have healthy activities with young people that don't involve drinking and drugs, which kind of ties into needing more recreation activities. I wonder if that conference still goes on and if we can maybe start sending people from Cambridge Bay every single year to that."

CAO Marla Limousin: "That's the age group that you identified, Pam, the 9-12-year-old girls that are in trouble and need activities."

Mayor Pamela Gross: "A solution could be to go to Michael's and get fun things and get people to volunteer to teach knitting, painting, photography and all of those fun things that they could do."

Councillor Jenna Kamingoak: "There's this really amazing program in the NWT that is called FOXY and it's for girls around the age 9-13. We should try and get a facilitator sent up here to host a work shop."

CAO Marla Limousin: "Was there an Inuit program similar to FOXY somewhere in the east?"

Deputy Mayor Angulalik Pedersen: "It was a FOXY Branch. Foxy helped them do it."

Councillor Sandi Gillis: "Another good program that Jill Taylor had started in Hay River was called Lights On. It was in the High School every Friday night from 9pm-midnight. There's lots of good stuff out there."

Mayor Pamela Gross: "We should have a discussion with the RCMP again. The program that people keep saying to get back is the D.A.R.E. Program."

Councillor Wilfred Wilcox: "There's so many people in this town that are having problems with liquor. I tell them to go to the Wellness Centre, but I don't know if I'm giving them good advice or who they could talk to. It's hard



for people go to and seek help first of all, and you want to make sure you're sending them to a place where they can receive the best care."

CAO Marla Limousin: "Right now, our staff is going through a 7-week training program with Arctic College to get more capacity in themselves and in helping the public. They are taking on so much mentally. The 7 week is about trauma, alcohol and addictions and how to work with people. There's a real foundation for them now, where as in the past, they knew certain parts but not the whole scenario. We've got the Youth Councillors understanding Suicide. Charles teaches the ASSIST Program; how to identify Suicide, or suicidal people who are entering that discussion and additions especially with the young kids. For the Youth Safe Home, we've written a proposal to get funding which might stop those kids from wandering around and having a safe space to go to. I'll let you know more in a couple weeks about that."

Councillor Wilfred Wilcox: "Wouldn't it be a part of planning? You are planning to train and maintain service. I think that's something that is important, having the service, doing all of the right things and to prepare people. Maybe there's stuff going on but we can't just shelve it."

CAO Marla Limousin: "Are we? Francis and Charles are both trained Social Workers and then there's a core group there."

Councillor Wilfred Wilcox: "Other than you, does anyone else know what other services that we offer with Wellness? Is there a notice?"

Mayor Pamela Gross: "She is working on a Website to get all of that information on because it has been something that we've talked about."

CAO Marla Limousin: "I can put together something on all of the programs and projects."

Councillor Wilfred Wilcox: "The information would be useful to all of the kids and their family."

Deputy Mayor Angulalik Pedersen: "When I was at the NAM Meetings, they mentioned an idea where they could put a little post card on every booze order with Alcohols Anonymous and a pamphlet of information if you're having issues or if you know of people who are having issues. The RCMP



brought it up as an idea just so that people had those numbers if they needed them."

Mayor Pamela Gross: "We just need to teach social drinking and responsible drinking, and also going to those MADD Programs.

Keep your eye out for funding. That's the only way we can have these programs going."

CAO Marla Limousin: "We don't have a Minor Hockey this year because nobody stepped up to the plate to coach. So, there is nothing going on for all of those young boys. How do we create volunteerism again? We have to figure out how to get a step forward to get people volunteering to coach and teach the fun classes. We reached out to several people and no one came forward."

Mayor Pamela Gross: "It takes a community. It has to be people who are fresh and want to step up and volunteer. We should talk about that sometime in our next Healthy Living meeting."

CAO Marla Limousin: "I need to ask you about the Women's Shelter. We have been writing since October about the funding because we are \$75,000 in the hole right now. No one is answering our emails. This is a very stressful situation every year. I was going to suggest a letter from you to our MLA, Jeannie Ehaloak to figure out how to fix this problem. We are trying to deal with Iqaluit but they are not answering. Their expectation is a 24/7-hour operation, and we sent a budget to the Minister but have had nothing yet.

Councillor Jenna Kamingoak: "Should we start pushing them. That is a lot of money."

Councillor Wilfred Wilcox: "Shouldn't we go to that department?"

Mayor Gross: "We will talk about that tomorrow Marla".
